IMMERSION

The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) traces its formation to the work and leadership of three individuals: Barton Stone, Thomas Campbell, and his son, Alexander Campbell. Of the three, we tend to focus upon Alexander, who developed a reputation as a gifted preacher, a skillful debater, and a prolific writer. Several years ago, this congregation presented me with an 1832 edition of Campbell's *The Sacred Writings of the Apostles and Evangelists of Jesus Christ, Commonly Styled The New Testament*. It was a revision of translations done by George Campbell, James MacKnight, and Philip Doddridge. The most frequently cited revisions added by Campbell are the substitutions of "immersion" and "immerse" for "baptism" and "baptize." It was his intention that when one read a New Testament account of the baptism of a new follower of Christ, the reader would clearly understand that the believer was fully and completely immersed, or 'dunked,' in water.

Immersion is a wonderful word to use when describing mission work. When our youth and adult leaders leave next week for their mission trip, they will have their eyes opened to a community and people they have not seen before. They will learn new names, share in new experiences, and be 'dunked' into mission. And just like with baptism, they will be changed.

Pray for Bryant Walker, Lauren Morse, Abby Matschke and Harold Barker as they journey to Minnesota. Pray that they might reflect Christ's love to every person they meet. Pray for lives to be changed. Pray for a safe journey. And then be prepared to be immersed into their experiences, as they share them in our July 16 worship services.

AN EYE FOR AN EYE LEAVES EVERYONE BLIND

Martin Luther King, Jr. is quoted as saying, "The old law of an eye for an eye leaves everyone blind." Jesus said, "You know that *Hebrew Scripture* sets this standard of *justice and punishment*: take an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth. But I say this: don't fight against the one who is working evil against you. If anyone strikes you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also. (Matthew 5:38 – *The Voice*).

Why would the Lord teach this? At first glimpse, he may be providing us a strategy for responding to those who hurt us or who angrily oppose what we say or do. Or, it might not be a strategy. Rather, it might be an example of how God responds to opposition. This principle was lived out in the life and death of Jesus, who went to the cross. It points to another reality, of how one lives in the Kingdom of God.

Our current political climate has highlighted differences between people and groups, between

family members, between friends. It has created animosity where it didn't exist before.

What to do? Well, this word from Jesus convicted me to pray. I do not have the power within to live as he commanded. My prayers are to be for the *people* with whom I so deeply disagree. This is hard to do. It requires submission to the Lord and his way of living. Retaliating comes more natural and easier to do.

A devotional life puts us in a position to learn why such messages come from God. It also empowers us to trust God above anything else. It is a time of encounter with the Holy Spirit in the midst of ordinary living.

I don't believe for a second that prayer will change their hearts. But I do believe it will likely change my heart. When I pray for someone, I start to see that person as I imagine God does: a flawed human being made in God's image and for whom Jesus died on the cross. Just like me. It will also likely make my heart a little softer.

Lord, help us to rethink our relationship with you and with those with whom we disagree. We want to turn toward you and gain a new life. Teach us to love as you love us for your name's sake that we might live in the Kingdom way. Amen.

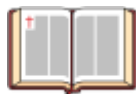

Angels watching over me.

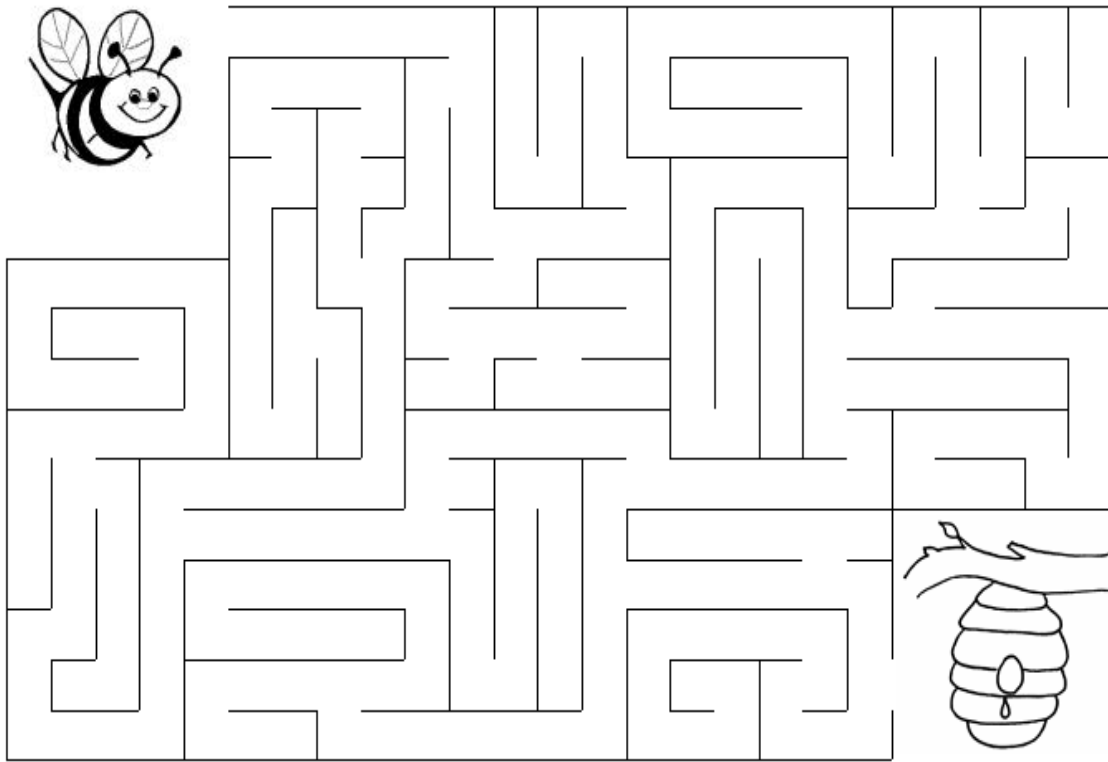
When Jesus was born, Herod was King. When he heard about the birth of Jesus, he thought that Jesus had come to set up a kingdom here on earth and he was not at all happy about that. He tried to find out where Jesus was so that he could kill him. An angel appeared to Joseph in a dream and warned him of the danger. "Get up! Flee to Egypt with the child and his mother," the angel said. "Stay there until I tell you to return, because Herod is going to search for the child to kill him." That night Joseph left for Egypt with Jesus and Mary. They stayed there until Herod died.

When Herod died, God's angel spoke to Joseph in a dream again. "Get up, take the child and his mother and return to Israel. All who were out to kill the child are dead."

Isn't it wonderful that God sent angels to watch over his infant son and protect him from harm? Well, God loves all of his children. He loves you and me and he sends angels to watch over us. In Psalm 91, the Bible says:

Evil can't get close to you, harm can't get through the door.
He ordered his angels to guard you wherever you go.
If you stumble, they'll catch you; their job is to keep you from falling.
(*Psalm 91:11-12 - The Message*)

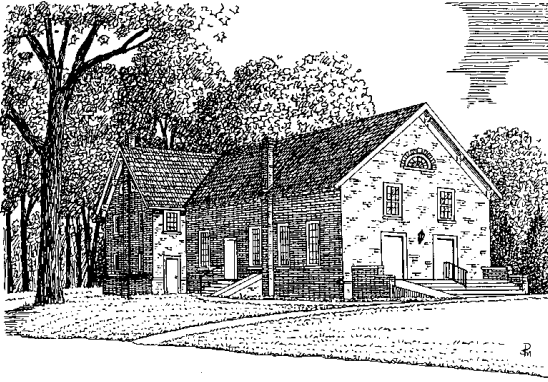
