CHRIST HAS DIED. CHRIST HAS RISEN. CHRIST WILL COME AGAIN

Lent this year has been particularly special due to its ecumenical nature. Every Wednesday we have met at a different partner church in our Upper James City County Ministerial fellowship. We have worshipped as Presbyterians, Disciples, Methodists, Lutherans, Baptists, and Mennonites. We have shared in each member church's tradition and liturgy. And as we have gathered around the Lord's Table, we have often shared the mystery of the faith with the words of one of the most ancient of Christian affirmations: Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again.

That affirmation will be front and center when we come together on Easter Sunday. It is our confession of faith that Christ is true. It is our proclamation that Christ is God incarnate, risen from the dead. It is our affirmation that Christ and his teachings is authoritative and central to the way we live our lives, and to our understanding of this world. I like the way Richard Stearns put it in his book, 'The Hole in Our Gospel.' Stearns wrote, "Christ is an all-or-nothing proposition, and one way or another, every one of us has already made a choice about Him. We have either committed our lives to Him wholeheartedly, or we have not."

On Easter Sunday we will gather for a Sunrise Service on the front steps of the church, recalling the women's early morning journey to Jesus' tomb after his crucifixion. Our 8:30 and 11:00 services will be filled with singing the great hymns of Easter and the resurrection. We will confess the mystery of our faith, and share the bread and cup.

But unless Jesus the Christ is the true Lord of our lives, our entire lives, our words are in danger of being a little empty. After all, Christ is an all-or-nothing proposition.

APRIL REFLECTIONS

- The community gathers in prayer for strength and to keep the story alive on Maundy Thursday, we observe the Last Supper and reflect on the words of Jesus and the response of his disciples, then and now.
- Some will pray at Olive Branch for the light of Christ to fill the darkness of our personal lives and the life of our country and church. Others will so pray at home. Our prayer vigil is fully supported.

May the Love of God enfold you. May the Light of God surround you. May the power of God protect you. May the presence of God watch over you. Wherever you are, God is. As Pastor Richard so often says. "Thanks be to God! Amen!"

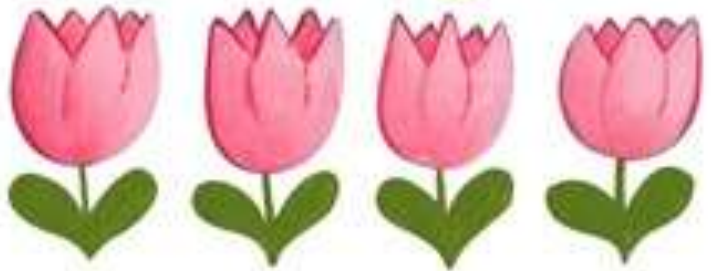

Jesus Is Alive!

Early in the morning, on the Sunday after Jesus was crucified, two women (Mary and Mary Magdalene) went to the grave where Jesus had been buried. As they were just about at the tomb the earth suddenly shook and an angel came down from heaven, and rolled away the stone at the entrance of the tomb. The women looked at each other and rubbed their eyes, they couldn't believe what they had seen, because it was very early in the morning, and they were still a little sleepy. The angel was so bright, almost as bright as lightning. His clothes were as white as snow. They were surprised to find an empty grave and wondered what had happened to Jesus.

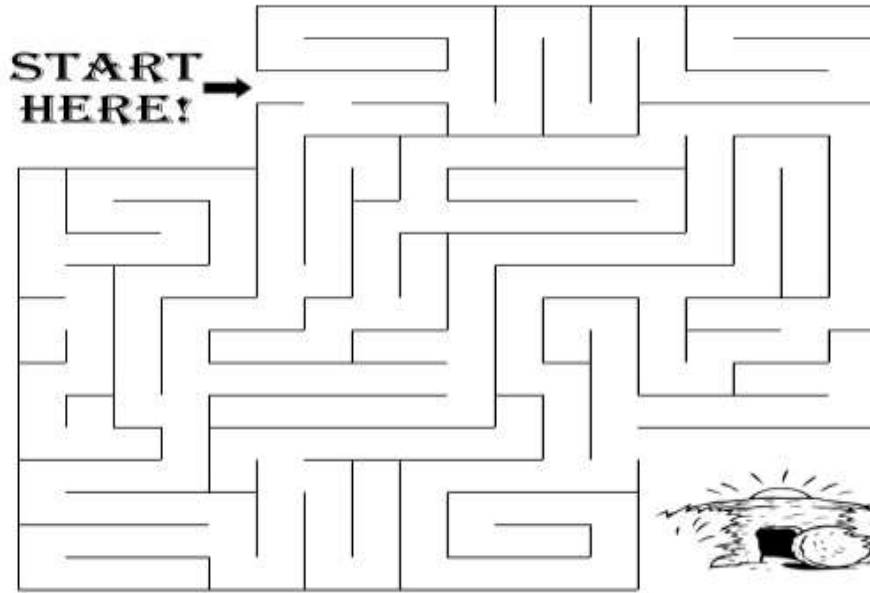

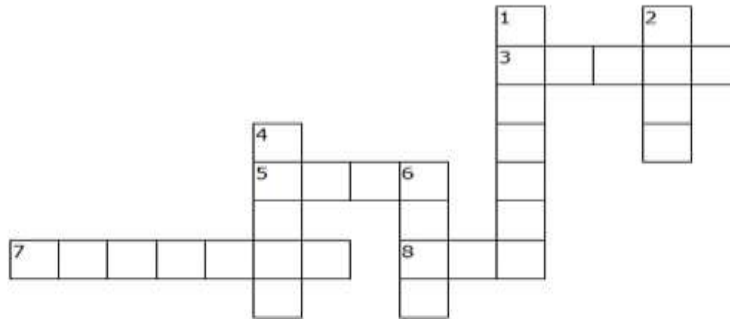

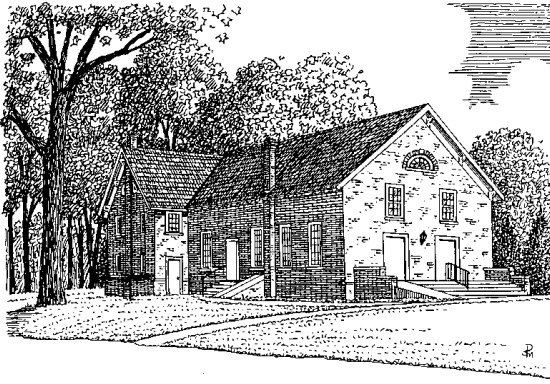
