#### YAWNS AND GROANS

I loved the sign so much I took a picture of it. Polly's at the Pier is a restaurant/coffeeshop/bar in the town

of Frederiksted on the island of St. Croix. St. Croix is the poster child of the quintessential tropical island paradise. When you are approaching Frederiksted by sea, there are no high-rise buildings. None of the typical tourist traps like "Senor Frog" or "Margaritaville" restaurants clutter the end of the docking pier. Only a small town, with plentiful green spaces, laid out in the traditional British colonial pattern of 7 streets by 7 streets.

Polly's is on one of the streets. Ann and I ran inside to escape the rain, and to quench our thirst. The coffee was strong and delicious. It wasn't until I had finished half the cup that I realized my yawns had disappeared. My yawning body was trying to tell my mind what I needed to drink!

As I noted in one of the last Wednesday's Family Night studies on Ephesians, prayer is important. All Christians pray, some more than others. Prayer is also very personal. We all pray differently, both in content and mode. Where are you when you pray? Do you have a set time or place? Do you close your eyes, bow your head, get down on your knees?

Mode is one thing; content is another. Sometimes it is difficult to know what to pray, what words to use, or how to make it sound "professionally religious". My advice is to remember what the Apostle Paul wrote: let the Spirit tell us. "In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans". (Romans 8:26)

Pray what is on your heart. Say your praises, count your blessings, give voice to your concerns, even yell out your complaints. Let the Spirit move you, and you will pray what needs to be said. For just as yawns call for coffee, so does the Spirit lead us to call out what we "ought to pray for... through wordless groans".

Prayer and coffee. A most excellent way to begin the morning!

#### **JULY SPECIAL EVENTS**

When we think of holidays or special events in July, we naturally think first of Independence Day. We may even think of summer vacations or other special occasions celebrated within our own families. But one other big special event is beginning in July this year.

The XXXIII Olympics Games will take place in Paris, France. These games will include sporting events such as swimming, gymnastics, track and field, rowing, weightlifting, boxing, beach volleyball, water polo, equestrian, surfing, skateboarding, diving, and badminton, just to name a few. There is even a new sport being added to the Games this year—breaking, or breakdancing.

For the first time in the history of the Olympic Summer Games, the Opening Ceremony will not take place in a stadium. Paris 2024 is breaking new ground by bringing sports into the city and the same will be true of the Opening Ceremony, set to be held in the heart of the city along its main artery: the Seine. Taking on a new guise, the parade of athletes will be held on the Seine with boats for each national delegation. These boats will be equipped with cameras to allow television and online viewers to see the athletes up close. Winding their way from east to west, the 10,500 athletes will cross through the centre of Paris, the overall playing field for the Games. The parade will come to the end of its 6-kilometer route in front of the Trocadéro, where the remaining elements of Olympic protocol and final shows will take place. 80 giant screens and strategically placed speakers will allow everyone to enjoy the magical atmosphere of this show reverberating throughout the French capital. The Opening Ceremony for the Olympic Games Paris 2024 will be the largest in Games history.

Over a billion viewers from around the world are expected to stream the Opening Ceremony based on data from Ceremonies past. Over 3 billion watch the Games, supporting their country's teams and players in each event. Will you be tuning in and cheering on Team USA? The Opening Ceremony will begin Friday, July 26 at 1:30PM EDT. The Games will continue through the Closing Ceremony on Sunday, August 11 at 3PM EDT.


