### **NEVER ALONE**

"We are born alone, we live alone, we die alone. Everything in-between is a gift."

I have always credited this quote to Yul Brynner, but I suspect some variation of this sentiment has been expressed by people for centuries. It is an observation on the human condition, and a particularly bleak one.

I prefer the one presented by H. Jackson Brown, Jr., the author of the book, *Life's Little Instruction Book*. He puts it this way: "Everyone you meet is afraid of something, loves something, and has lost something." I would add one more thing: everyone you meet is searching for answers as to why.

On Sunday, November 10, we will gather to remember loved ones and friends that we have lost over the last year. We will honor them with a roll call of the saints, and sing together the traditional hymn for the day, "For All the Saints". And while we might not be able to

fully satisfy why we have lost the ones we loved, we will begin to heal.

Our healing will be found in worship by being in fellowship with our church family, through prayer, singing hymns, sharing the bread and cup at the Lord's table, and seeking God's presence in quiet reflection. I have found, time and time again, that it is in the church's words and deeds that the questions that come from living on this planet find their answers – and most importantly, their purpose.

So, as you gather in worship, look at the faces of those around you. We all share things in common. We are all afraid of something; we all have loved; and we all have lost something. All of which makes us vulnerable, fragile, and broken – but most importantly, never alone.

# OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOX/CHRISTMAS CHILD COMING!

Our next effort will be the Shoebox Project. <u>Due date</u> <u>for all boxes is November 11.</u> Instructions are available in Branch Hall, outside the office, or in the narthex.

The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world. Through this project, Samaritan's Purse partners with the local church worldwide to share the Good News of Jesus Christ and make disciples of the nations.

Samaritan's Purse has collected shoebox gifts filled with toys, school supplies, and hygiene items for children around the world. Since 1993, more than 198 million children in more than 170 countries and territories have received an Operation Christmas Child shoebox. The project delivers not only the joy of what, for many kids, is their first gift ever, but also gives them a tangible expression of God's love.

This whole process is made possible by caring individuals who pack shoeboxes full of quality gifts for children in need. Many of these shoebox packers also use our Follow Your Box feature to discover the country where their gift will be delivered.

More than 9,000 year-round volunteers also get the word out about the Samaritan's Purse project across the U.S. In addition, some 80,000 short-term volunteers serve in more than 4,000 drop-off locations open across the country every year during National Collection Week, the third week in November. Each shoebox collected then travels to one of our processing centers to be inspected and prepared for international shipment by 90,000 volunteers. All of this is supported by the 30,000 volunteers in our prayer network.

I would like to challenge people who are preparing shoebox gifts to also write a letter showing God's love. What's written there may be very simple, but those simple words could completely change somebody's life.

### FRANKLIN GRAHAM UPDATE

Samaritan's Purse responded on an unprecedented scale following the disasters left by Hurricanes Helene & Milton. We deployed 6 Disaster Relief Units, 3 toward the Gulf Coast working in Tampa and Perry, FL, and

Valdosta, GA, and 3 more in the NC mountains in Boone, Asheville, and Burnsville.

Because so many roads were washed out, Samaritan's Purse coordinated a fleet of 10 helicopters (including Army Chinooks, Blackhawks, and NASCAR team choppers) to airlift food, water, medical supplies, and hundreds of generators to those who were stranded. We set up emergency medical facilities, installed dozens of Starlink satellite devices to restore communications, and operated water filters in towns where municipal water systems were wiped out.

Experts say the Southeast was deluged by 40 trillion gallons of rain. Landslides crashed into homes, houses washed off their foundations, and people were stranded on rooftops. Near Boone, not far from our headquarters, several neighbors were trapped by a landslide and rising waters. Among those neighbors were members of our team who helped rescue the group, including a 10-day-old newborn and other children. Those affected broke down in tears witnessing team members cleaning out their homes. "I've never experienced God's love like that," one neighbor said. "We're not crying because of what we lost. We're crying because love showed up."

We thank God for the thousands of volunteers who have already responded. Boone and Asheville were blessed with the largest single-day turnouts in the history of Samaritan's Purse. We're going to need lots more volunteers in the weeks and months ahead, as we help our neighbors in the Name of Jesus Christ. It will take a long time for these places to recover, and Samaritan's Purse is doing all we can to get them back on their feet. Please lift up these families and communities in prayer. Thank you for your prayers and generous support for Samaritan's Purse. May God bless you!


