TWO CHURCHES, ONE GOD

On Sunday, May 4th, I did something I had never done before. In forty plus years of ministry, I have never been part of a combined Sunday morning worship service of two churches. But on that day, the congregations of Olive Branch Christian Church and Oak Grove Baptist Church worshipped together in one great and glorious hour of praises to the God who made us all. Rev. Keller preached, Deacon Tabb played, the Oak Grove Choir sang, and together we

gave witness to Jesus' prayer in John's gospel, "That they may all be one".

Ecumenism is part of our Disciples of Christ DNA. During the Second Great Awakening of America's religious history, a minister by the name of Barton Stone was serving the Presbyterian Church in Cane Ridge, Kentucky. A week-long revival was held in 1801 centered around this church, with somewhere between 10,000 and 20,000 people attending the revival at some point during the week. Different clergy would preach, including Presbyterians, Methodists, and Baptists. On the final Sunday of the revival, communion was celebrated. Not once was a person's denominational affiliation questioned. All were welcomed.

Barton Stone would go on to be one of the founding leaders of the Disciple Church. He believed that Jesus desired unity among his followers. One of Stone's most famous quotes is, "Let unity be our polar star". He thought it should be the guiding light of the Christian Church. Our greeting to every person who walks through the doors of Olive Branch should be, "Welcome! Welcome to this place! All are welcomed here!"

I think Jesus might have been pleased at our Sunday worship with Oak Grove. I know I was.

DID YOU KNOW?

It's June! And with a new month comes a set of new, or rather seemingly new, national "day of" days. For example, did you know that June 4 is National Hug Your Cat Day?

June 1 carries many titles to its day. Buzzr, a game show channel, celebrates National Game Show Day on June 1. National Nail Polish Day is celebrated on the same day, as are National Olive Day, and National Hazelnut Cake Day (yum!). National Pen Pal Day,

National Go Barefoot Day, and National Say Something Nice Day are all also celebrated on June 1.

Some personal favorites might be National Cheese Day, celebrated on June 4, National Chocolate Ice Cream Day celebrated on June 7, National Strawberry Rhubarb Pie Day celebrated on June 9, or National Iced Tea Day which is celebrated June 10.

National Doughnut Day is celebrated on the first Friday in June, which happens to be June 6 this year. This particular day holds quite a bit of history to its origin. This food holiday celebrates not only the delicious doughnut, but also honors the Salvation Army Lassies. The Salvation Army Lassies are the women who served doughnuts to soldiers during WWI. Over 4 million U.S. men and women served during the war, with almost 3 million of those serving overseas. With conflicts taking place in Europe, the Middle East, Asia, Africa and the Pacific, WWI was most difficult for troops fighting on the front lines.

In 1917, a group of women were sent to the front lines in France by The Salvation Army. They were directed to set up field bases near the front lines to try to boost morale among troops. The makeshift "huts" were a place where soldiers could stock up on necessities and get a small break from the fighting. Little did they know The Salvation Army Lassie's would not only boost morale, but make history in the creation of one of the most celebrated food holidays.

The women who were working at the field bases felt they wanted to do more than simply restocking troop supplies. They began making home-cooked food for the troops in hopes the food would give them a small taste of home. During this time, the Lassies began handing out a sweet baked treat that would become known as The Salvation Army Doughnut. The story says the doughnuts were cooked inside the helmets of the troops, dubbing them as "doughboys", which was a standard term used for donut. The Donut Lassies are said to be the reason we have National Doughnut Day today!

I see God in Creation,


Jesus came to Earth as a man,
