## **BRIDGE BUILDERS**

I have driven down I-75 in Florida for years. There are many unique things to see along the sides of that road; but the strangest item for me is one that crosses the interstate just south of Ocala. It looks like an overpass but has trees and bushes growing on it. I never could figure it out, until recently when Ann and I rode our bikes over it: the I-75 Florida Landbridge.

It is a trailhead for hikers and cyclers, and the first of its kind in the United States. It was developed for wildlife and humans to cross over the interstate in safety. The bridge, which is 52 feet wide by 200 feet long, follows a natural ridge over 100 feet in elevation. The planters on both sides of the bridge contain plants native to the surrounding area. The walls were built from local fieldstone. Wildlife cameras on the bridge, monitored by staff, have captured photos of numerous crossings of the bridge by bobcats, coyote, wild turkey and even Florida black bears.

There is another one-of-a-kind bridge—the church. I believe the church of Jesus Christ is a bridge; a bridge that seeks to connect the gap between who we are and who God created us to be, to end the division we see today in our nation across the lines of race, class, gender, and politics.

Olive Branch was created to span the divide that exists among God's creation. We follow in the footsteps of God the bridge builder, who sent Jesus to bridge the gap in the relationship between the creator and creation. Our ministry as bridge builders is to span the gaps and build bridges of compassion, mercy, and reconciliation. This is who we are as the church. The Florida Landbridge exists to help God's creatures to cross from one side to the other. Olive Branch exists to help people get to their other side, from lost to found, from broken to whole, from division to unity, from anger to love. Be a bridge builder! Welcome all of God's children to this place!

#### CHRISTIAN HOSPITAL MUNGELI NEWS

Dr. Dennis David, interim director, recently shared the following story with us about the unique work being done by CHM, our global ministries partner, in Mungeli, India:

Soniya Bai, a 70-year-old lady, presented to us with a history of her slip and fall at home which resulted in her right femur getting fractured. She has been bedridden for two months. When asked by her family members why they hadn't operated on her yet, they discovered she had been initially taken to a doctor who had advised conservative management and had put her in a cast and immobilized her. The family members later took it off and had kept her at home. After a few weeks, they had visited CIMS Bilaspur where she was referred due to high-risk status of the patient and then they brought her to the district hospital where she was again denied surgery due to the fact that the fracture had been neglected for over 2 months and had signs of nonunion. She also had associated high-risk status with anemia and multiple bed sores. Soniya Bai also had a neglected urinary catheter retained for 2 months due to which she had developed a urinary tract infection. After getting admitted at CHM, she was given antibiotics, blood transfusions, and was carefully monitored for one week after which she successfully underwent surgery for fixation of her femur fracture. She had been neglected by multiple health care centers due to her high-risk status and associated health ailments, but it gives us immense joy and satisfaction to have been able to provide her with required medical and surgical care here at CHM.
