MOMENTS

I scrolled across this picture this past week. It was taken on August 14, 2016, at the dedication service of

the new front stoop and handicap ramp. It's a wonderful picture, everyone is smiling, and even the most casual observer would declare it to be a happy day in the life of our church. But pictures like these can also be bittersweet, as they remind us of loved ones and friends that are no longer with us. In looking over this picture, I see members who have moved to other locations. I see members who have passed. I see some members who look the same. I see many that do not.

Old pictures can solicit a visceral reaction. I know of people who want nothing to do with having their picture taken, much less viewing old photos of times when they were young. I can sympathize with how they feel. But I also see value in captured moments. These pictures give us a snapshot in time. On that August Sunday afternoon, we captured a moment that will never come again. A moment I like to call a "God Moment", when the Holy is moving in our lives.

Life is not just valued in the number of years lived. The richness of life is in its moments. I believe that our lives become more meaningful when we realize a simple truth: life consists of moments that help us to understand how God is moving and working in our lives.

God moments occur in our lives when the Holy connects with us, to work in our lives, to give us hope. Such moments give us a sense of peace, and the assurance that everything – everything! – will be ok. Not all such moments are big and grand. Most are small and simple and might go unnoticed if we were not looking for them. The truth is, God is always

working in our lives, every day, every hour, every minute.

So treasure life's moments. God has gifted us with life in which to love and be loved. Our moments will pass more quickly than we can imagine. Live as the Psalmist declared in Psalm 118: "This is the day the Lord has made. We will rejoice and be glad in it." Thank you for all the moments we have shared.

A message from Dr. Vinod Ekka:

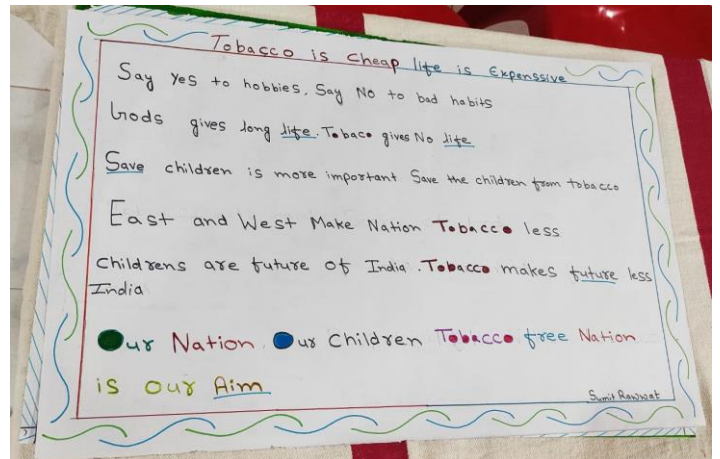

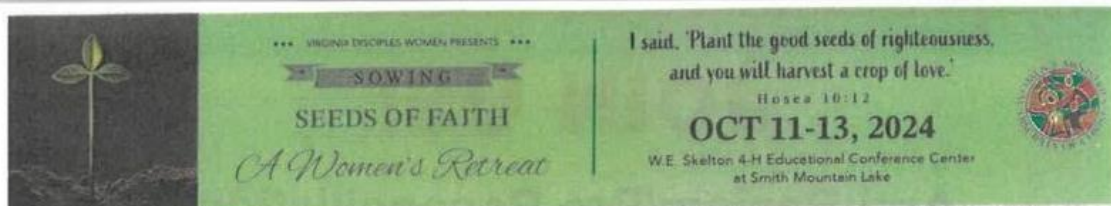

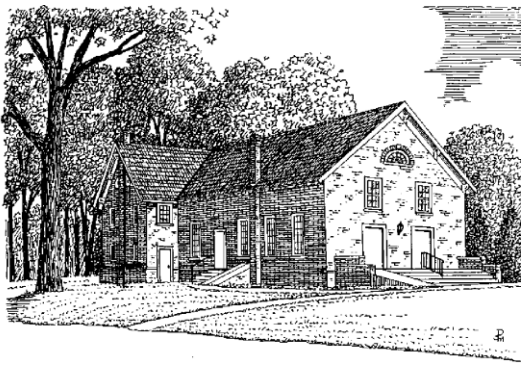
